Pursuant to KRS 15.100(2), Bobby Stokes, Executive Director called roll. After the roll was called, a quorum was announced, and the meeting was called to order.

Bobby Stokes welcomed everyone to the meeting. He reminded everyone since this is a special meeting, conversations would be limited to only topics on the agenda.

## ADMINISTRATIVE

Bobby announced due the recent order present by the Supreme Court, order 2022-SC-0289-KB Inquiry Commission v Ronnie Lee Goldy Jr. the PAC Council felt it necessary to address the decision and decide if any course of action is necessary by the Council.

Chris Cohron stated on September 16, 2022, Chief Justice Supreme Court signed and issued an order requesting a special commissioner and temporary suspension of Ronald Goldy Jr., This is titled 20-2022-SC0289-KP, which is the inquiring commission vs. Ronald Lee Goldy Jr. Chris stated that everyone had been provided with the order of documents. The issues brought forth have temporarily suspended Mr. Goldy from practicing the law until further action from the supreme court.

Chris expressed concerns that this will initiate KRS 15.715 specifically sub section 1, conflict of interest as a prosecutor. PAC Council may authorize with a vote of no less than 5 of its members for the Attorney General to initiate, intervene, supersede a local prosecutor for the purpose of prosecuting criminal business in question of the commonwealth in a circuit or district.

Chris explained the supreme court order issued would potentially initiate KRS 15.715 which is described in subsections 2,3, and 4 leading to KRS 61.120 in addition to KRS 61.130 regarding the salary of the prosecutor being potentially suspended if 15.715 isn't active.

Chris informed everyone the intention of today's meeting is to seek a vote regarding KRS 15.715.

Chris expressed the great duty a Commonwealth's Attorney has to their jurisdiction and the confidence of their community for justice. He stated the document's presented show a complete lack of trust to adequately represent his jurisdiction combined with the fact

that Ronald Goldy Jr. is currently unable to practice the law there by abdicating the ability to act as Commonwealth's Attorney.

Chris made a motion pursuant to KRS 15.715, stating due to Mr. Goldy's inability to act as Commonwealth's Attorney, the Attorney General shall initiate, intervene, or supersede him for the purpose of prosecuting the criminal business in the 21<sup>st</sup> Judicial Circuit pending further orders of the Supreme Court of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, seconded by Shane Young.

Bobby asked at this time if anyone would like to discuss anything regarding this matter and if Mr. Goldy would like to address the Council.

Ronald Goldy reiterated his suspension is currently temporary and other issues are being addressed.

Chris explained that regardless of Mr. Goldy's suspension currently being temporary, Mr. Goldy is the current sitting Commonwealth's Attorney and that he cannot currently practice law and has thereby failed his jurisdiction by his own actions. Approving this motion by the Council will initiate KRS 61.120 as well as KRS 61.130.

Chris asked that the Attorney General intercede and seek remedy pursuant to KRS 15.175 subsection 2.

Bobby asked if there were additional questions for the Council.

Bobby reiterated the motion made by Chris to initiate KRS 15.715 as it relates to the 21<sup>st</sup> Judicial Circuit and Mr. Ronald Goldy, seconded by Shane Young, and passed by voice vote.

# Administrative and budget expenditures rules related to the 21st Judicial Circuit

Bobby announced the necessity to discuss any rules that need to be in place and how to utilize the 21<sup>st</sup> Judicial Circuit's administrative responsibilities. Additionally, how to go forward regarding any Asset forfeiture funds and personnel changes due to the current circumstances regarding the 21<sup>st</sup> Judicial Circuit.

Chris made a motion that any expenditure or Asset Forfeiture funds for approval be brought before the PAC Council for approval before any funds can be spent in the 21<sup>st</sup> Judicial Circuit, seconded by Courtney Baxter, and passed by voice vote.

Chris made a motion that until such time as the Attorney General if approved according to KRS 15.715 is granted the authority by a circuit court to make decisions regarding the

Bobby asked if anyone has anything further related to comments or discussions currently on the agenda.

Bobby reminded members and guests that he next meeting of the Prosecutors Advisory Council would be on Friday June October 21,2022.

A motion to adjourn was made by Courtney Baxter, seconded by Aaron Dail, and passed by voice vote.
